Health Policy in the European Multilevel Governance System

I. Course contents & desired learning outcomes

This seminar offers an overview of the genesis and implementation of health policy in the multilevel governance system of the European Union. To this end, it takes into account the distribution of legislative and executive power and of political competences at

- a) The EU level (including insight into current and ongoing processes of change),
- b) The national level (taking into consideration various types of healthcare regimes), and
- c) The regional and communal level (with differing extents of power in different EU member states).

With a view to current developments – both in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic and beyond – the seminar sheds light on the growing importance, and not least the increasing politicisation, of health policy in the European multilevel governance system. It furthermore discusses the repercussions of these current developments in policy-making processes and outcomes.

II. Reading guidance

The reading material for the preparation of each unit is accessible via Digicampus. The contents of each unit build on the knowledge provided by the respective reading material. It is therefore expected that every student reads the respective texts for each unit and actively engages with them, as we will also do during the course sessions. Students may also use the reading material as basis for the unit tasks, as well as the final assessment.

III. Requirements for successful completion of the course

Within the scope of this seminar, the following is asked of the participating students:

- a) Active course participation in both synchronous and asynchronous elements of the course,
- b) Active engagement with the reading material,
- c) Individual tasks within each unit,
- d) Written final assessment (different options are discussed during the seminar).

You may work in small groups. We distribute responsibilities for each of the above-mentioned institutions at the virtual session on 2 December. Please upload your graphic overview on Digicampus by 15 December; and please make sure to also have a look at the overviews of your fellow classmates.

You may work in small groups. We distribute the different actors' roles during the virtual session on 13 January. Please research the positions of your respective actor and construct your line of argumentation accordingly.
